What happens when we don't have the things we need?



POVERTY

When people are unable to meet their everyday needs for food, water, clothing and shelter, they are living in poverty.

SOCIAL EXCLUSION

Social exclusion occurs when members of the community can't take part in certain activities such as taking holidays or visiting a doctor or dentist.



Vinnies Youth are a Society of St Vincent de Paul (SVDP) group in a school who get together to help people in need within their school and local community.



Who is Saint Vincent de Paul?



Born: 24 April 1581 Died: 27 September 1660

Vincent de Paul, was a French Catholic Priest who dedicated himself to serving the poor. He was reknown for his compassion, humility and generosity.

The Society was named after Saint Vincent de Paul and follows his teachings and compassion for people in need. Saint Vincent de Paul is the international patron of the Society.

Frédéric Ozanam - the Founder of SVDP



Born: 23 April 1813 Died: 8 September 1853

In 1833, as a 20 year old student in Paris and a devote Christian, Frédéric was questioned on what he was doing to help the marginalised in society apart from preaching to others. His response was to gather a group of friends to help him deliver fire wood and clothing to people on the streets. The small group decided to adopt the name The Society of St Vincent de Paul. One group turned into many throughout France and then the world, becoming what are known as 'Conferences' today.

Courage


Finding the courage to be close to those who are vulnerable and lonely, and act on their behalf.
